DPE/Preliminary Plat Review Process

- 1. Application Submitted to ESI for Minimum Submission Review (MSR).
- 2. Upon acceptance by ESI, application submitted to Loudoun County
 - Acceptance of the application by ESI will constitute the County's Minimum Submission Review
- 3. Project Planner Assigned/Fatal Flaw Review
 - Proffer compliance
 - Permitted Use
 - Submittal information to include Health Certificate, Soils report, Phase IA etc. (5 day review versus the normal 10)
- 4. Application sent on referral/ESI Team Peer Review (TPR) Meeting Scheduled
 - Upon acceptance, project planner notifies applicant of acceptance and ESI TPR meeting date
 - ESI TPR meeting scheduled within 30 calendar days from acceptance*
 - Remaining referrals comments due 30 calendar days from acceptance*
 - ESI TPR meeting to include Office of Transportation Services, Health Department (rural), Mapping, ERT, Soils (if applicable), Archeologist, and Project Planner
- 5. ESI Team Peer Review Meeting
 - Referral agencies come to the meeting with written comments
 - Comments are provided and discussed with the applicant
 - Issues or concerns are resolved at the meeting
 - If an issue is so significant that it cannot be resolved at the meeting, a separate meeting with the specific agency may be scheduled
- 6. Within 5 working days the project planner drafts a summary of the Peer Review meeting and forwards a copy to all in attendance, including the ESI representative
- 7. Upon receipt of comments from other agencies the project planner will immediately forward them to the applicant
- 8. Revised preliminary plat is submitted to ESI to verify that comments have been addressed
- 9. ESI performs a MSR and if acceptable, applicant forwards revised plats to the County for 2nd submission review; no submission is to occur to the County unless and until all referral comments have been completed and forwarded to the applicant

- 10. Revised plats sent to appropriate agencies with request for comments within 3 weeks
- 11. If all comments have been adequately addressed, staff may request signature sets; otherwise a second comment letter will be sent
- 12. If signature sets cannot be requested due to outstanding issues, the second submission process will be followed for subsequent submissions
